### **RESOLUTION IN FULL SUPPORT OF PROTECTING AND PRESERVING THE GLEN COVE SHELLMOUND BURIAL SITE (AKA GLEN COVE WATERFRONT PARK) AS A SACRED SITE**

**RESOLUTION OF APRIL 01, 2010**

**RESOLUTION NO.: 04012010-03**

- WHEREAS:** The Kashia Band of Pomo Indians of Stewarts Point Rancheria is recognized as a sovereign government by the United States of America; and
- WHEREAS:** The Kashia Band of Pomo Indians of Stewarts Point Rancheria is governed under a Constitution and Bylaws duly adopted and approved by the Secretary of the interior on March 11, 1936; and
- WHEREAS:** Article IV, Section 1(a) of the Tribal Constitution authorizes the governing body to enter into negotiations with the federal, state, or local agencies on behalf of the Kashia Band of Pomo Indians of Stewarts Point Rancheria; and
- WHEREAS:** The Tribal Business Committee of the Kashia Band of Pomo Indians hereafter (the Tribe) is a duly authorized governing body, empowered to conduct government affairs on behalf of the people and to promote and foster the economic development and the health and well being of the general membership; and
- WHEREAS:** The Tribe is and has been active and deliberate in the protection of Indigenous traditional, religious, civil and inherent sovereign rights;
- WHEREAS:** The Tribe acknowledges the Glen Cove Shellmound Burial Site (aka Glen Cove Waterfront Park) as a sacred site that must be protected and preserved for its historical, cultural and religious value; and
- WHEREAS:** The Greater Vallejo Recreation District (GVRD) and the City of Vallejo are currently purposing to develop a park with trails and amendments that would desecrate the Glen Cove Shellmound Burial Site; and
- WHEREAS:** The Tribe is in support of preserving this historic sacred site.


**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Business Committee of the Tribe acknowledges the Glen Cove Shellmound Burial (aka Glen Cove Waterfront Park) a sacred site that deserves/demands protection and respect.
